Il workshop è stato promosso dal CESET in sinergia con il Laboratoire d'études sur les monothéismes (LEM), unità mista di ricerca (UMR 8584 del CNRS), con la tutela de l'École pratique des hautes études, ma anche dell'Università Paris IV Sorbonne et dell'Università Jean-Monnet de Saint-Étienne ed ha ricevuto il patrocinio della Società Italiana per lo Studio del Pensiero Medievale.

L'occasione, data dalla pubblicazione del *Brill's Companion to the Reception of Pythagoras and Pythagoreanism in the Middle Ages and the Renaissance*, ed. by Irene Caiazzo, Constantinos Macris, Aurélien Robert, ha consentito di ricordare il magistero di Paolo Lucentini (1937-2011), professore ordinario di Storia della filosofia medievale all'Orientale dal 1986, le cui edizioni critiche hanno determinato un arricchimento nell'ambito dell'ermetismo, del platonismo e delle filosofie dissidenti.

Il confronto tra le due tradizioni pseudo-epigrafiche, quella pitagorica e quella ermetica, come hanno dimostrato gli specialisti intervenuti, rivela un prezioso patrimonio, solo in parte edito criticamente. Esso ci proietta in ricerche future sempre più impegnative, in cui la filosofia medievale, e con essa la storia del pensiero, recupera – ancora una volta – appieno la dignità del suo insostituibile ruolo.
